September is back to school time at church as well as in our community. Providing for the spiritual development of children is core to our congregation's identity. We have fine Sunday School/Godly Play materials, but need teachers. Many of you know that our search for a Christian Educator has not succeeded. So, we are on Plan B.

Former educator, Kyra Blank, has offered to get us started by organizing and training teams of volunteers to serve the children on Sunday mornings. We are hoping that there will be enough volunteer teachers and assistants in the rotation that no one will be asked to miss worship more than once or twice a month. We need to have two adults in the classroom for child and adult safety.

You don't need teaching experience to serve children and families! Kyra's training event will show you the lessons, how to prepare and where to find supplies!

It is going to take all of us to sustain this vital offering for our youngest members. Please be generous with your time and energy.

The training will be: September 13th, from 1-4:30pm, beginning in the Westminster Room

Did you know that there is a Presbyterian Older Adult Ministries Network? They have a national conference, and a newsletter. As a network of persons engaged in ministry with older adults, POAMN's mission includes nurturing the faith community, equipping leadership, and resourcing congregations and other organizations that minister to, for, and with older adults. 
PEACE AND GLOBAL WITNESS OFFERING


We need your assistance:
