Newport FPC hosts 2nd Annual Worship and Potluck for World Communion Sunday. Central Coastal Presbyterians will gather on October 5th, at 11am

We will host three other central coastal Presbyterian Churches to celebrate Worldwide Communion Sunday and witness to the light we shine in our shared identity as Presbyterian Christians. In challenging and difficult times, we will explore how we can be a light to the world. The service begins at 11am to allow our guests time to arrive from throughout Lincoln County.

Participating churches include Chapel by the Sea from Lincoln City, Community Presbyterian Church from Waldport, Community Presbyterian Church from Yachats and First Presbyterian Church from Newport. Each of these churches are part of the Presbytery of the Cascades and all are in Lincoln County.

Come at 10am for rehearsal if you would like to sing in the choir for the day. (Music is available in advance from Margaret Mortimore.) All are invited to join in a combined choir, singing an anthem composed by Milo Graamans: You Can Be the Light.



To welcome so many guests, it takes many hands and hearts. Please consider signing up for one or more tasks. We will have folks from every church assigned to work together.

Each church will provide one:

Food greeter: (to welcome and take potluck dishes as worshippers arrive, wheeling loaded carts to kitchen; leave worship at final hymn to prepare potluck with Kitchen folks)

Worship Assistant/Usher (to assist people as needed - locating toilets, first aid, offering)

Communion Server (assigned to serve with a pastor at one of the communion stations)

Kitchen (receive and organize food to hold until after worship; leave worship at final hymn to prepare potluck with Food greeters to put food on tables with appropriate serving tools.)

Liturgist (to read prayers or other scripted material) **Storyteller** (to report on how their congregation shines its light in difficult times)

Clean Up Kitchen (send dishes home, wash serving spoons, empty and wash beverage servers, match lids with casseroles)

Clean Up Hall (clear tables, put away tables and chairs, sweep floor, take out garbage,etc)

Set Up of tables and chairs will be done by Lincoln City Chapel by the Sea Men's Group on Saturday morning.

Tables will be set with placemats, tableware, napkins on Saturday afternoon.
